The design of The University of Scranton's Loyola Science Center made extensive use of high-efficiency glazing to reduce energy use, enhance visibility and views and put science on display. Because of this LEED initiative, the project obtained LEED Gold Certification in lieu of the anticipated LEED Silver.

The Loyola Science Center features formal and informal learning spaces designed to promote discussion and debate. The layout encourages integration among the traditional STEM programs, as well as the humanities, to drive the development of new teaching methods and engage students.
